Strategy aims for disadvantaged pupils – Teaching & Learning (whole school)

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Developing practitioners. Ensure all relevant staff (including new staff) have received paid-for training to deliver the phonics scheme effectively. Invest in Early Reading training and resources to support our youngest readers to achieve. Purchase of non-fiction books and 'boy friendly' texts to encourage enjoyment.
Priority 2	Manipulatives and representations. Work with the maths hub and purchase textbooks/resources to embed Teaching for Mastery across all year groups. Staff to attend training as required. Provide resources or children who need these at home.
Priority 3	Targeted support. Teaching Assistants to deliver high quality interventions to ensure children 'keep up not catch up'. At least 3 sessions a week per year group. Provide opportunities for every child to succeed in the lesson or catch up during the day. Increase the number of teaching assistants to provide support.
Priority 4	Home support. Purchase high quality subscriptions to supplement the teaching and learning of key concepts and areas. Improve home school engagement. Communicate ideas on how parents/carers can best support at home with learning and extending the school day. Provide communication and access direct to teachers through year group emails.

Priority 5	Magic breakfast. All children to receive breakfast when arriving at school. Support transition to morning learning time. Staff deployment and food supplies. Purchase of equipment and employment of a cater to prepare.
Priority 6	Metacognition and self-regulation INSET for all staff. Support children with a range of skills within the classroom and develop long life learners. Skills to support children to be self-motivated and have a positive learning attitude when faced with challenges. Monitoring and assessment carried out by Deputy Headteacher.
Priority 7	Development and training for an additional Learning Mentor to support safeguarding issues, mental health across the school and well-being. Children to access via a monitored worry box system or requesting direct with a member of staff. Ongoing training of

Priority 1	Targeted support. Purchase Accelerated Reader and Accelerated Maths. Increase reading for pleasure and proficiency in basic maths skills. Carry out Local Authority Baseline tests to highlight children for National Tutoring Programme. Allocate staff analysis time and supply/teacher to deliver within school time.

Priority 2	Establish small group maths, reading and writing interventions for disadvantaged pupils falling behind agerelated expectations. Focus initially on Years 2, 4 and 6.
Priority 3	Parental engagement. Support with practical strategies, sharing curriculum information. Improve communication and provide intensive support workshops for relevant curriculum areas. Online quality provision purchased to support and promote home learning. Communicate ways to support children at home with remote learning, reading, writing and maths.
Priority 4	Monetary needs. Supply and support the purchasing of school uniform and resources required to maximise teaching and learning opportunities at home and at school. Supplement school visits and visitors to school. Provide children with role models and experiences that they would not normally be exposed to. Purchase of training for peer supporters, playground leaders and ICT champions in the school. Enhance charity collections and fundraising to raise awareness direct with the children and families.
Priority 5	SEMH/behaviour and attendance. Support SEMH and behaviour inside school. EWO to support in punctuality and attendance. Purchase of external providers to support in the SEMH and behaviour process and systems. Investment of second Learning mentor.
