	The author of 'The Enormous Crocodile' is Roald Dahl. Create a fact file about this author. What other books has he written?	Make an analogue clock and practice telling the time to the hour and half past. Extend to quarter past and quarter to the hour. Write down your daily timetable e.g. what do you do at 8 o'clock in the morning?	Make a paper bag crocodile and put on a puppet show.
**	In the story, the crocodile is looking for something delicious to eat. Create a new dish for the crocodile and write some instructions of how to make it.	Find 5 objects and measure each one in cm. Draw them in your homework book in order of length. Label their lengths in cm. How much longer is the longest object than the shortest object? Are there any objects that are the same length?	Find out where crocodiles live in the wild and create a fact file about one of those countries. Draw and label a map of the country you have chosen.
	Imagine that you are a jungle animal and that you have left the jungle and are travelling around. What would you do? Where would you go? What adventures would you have? Write an amazing story about your experiences.	'The total length of all someone's fingers is the same as the length of one of their arms.' Investigate this statement. Measure each of your fingers and thumb on one hand in cm and add them altogether. Then measure the length of your arm and compare the 2 lengths. What did you discover? Try with other members of your family.	Take a voyage along the River Nile. Find out about the habitats and the people and animals that you will encounter. Present your findings in a creative way.
