	Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs - Give Us A Story - YouTube Open the link and listen to the story of Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs. Retell the story (verbally) to someone at home.	Find your favourite toy. Now find 2 things bigger and 2 things smaller than your toy. You could draw some pictures or take some photographs to show your findings.	Draw a picture of your favourite dinosaurs.
	Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs - Give Us A Story - YouTube Open the link and listen to the story of Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs. Now can you make a list of Harry's dinosaurs?	Go on a number hunt around your home or neighbourhood. How many numbers can you find? You could take some photographs to show different places where you have found numbers or make a list of the numbers you have found.	Make a model dinosaur land using cardboard from cereal packs, playdoh, paint, sand and scrunched up paper.
**	Choose one of Harry's dinosaurs. Think of some adjectives to describe the dinosaur. Write 3 sentences using your adjectives.	Find 2 dice or use RANDOM.ORG - Dice Roller Roll the 2 dice and add the numbers together. 3 + 5 = 8	Research dinosaurs and create a presentation of your findings. You can present your work as a poster, PowerPoint or as a booklet.

Make up your own story about a dinosaur. Write your story or act it out to your family. You could ask your family members to get involved!
