	Imagine you were on an expedition to the summit of Mt Everest. Write a diary of your trip.	Plan a trip to Mt Everest from home and produce a time line to show how long it would take to get there and climb the mountain (use Google to find flight time etc).	Decide what you would need in your survival bag to take with you when climbing Mount Everest. List 10 items and explain why you need them.
	Write a mountain adventure story. You could be an explorer trying to reach the summit of an unclimbed mountain, you could have got lost on Mt Everest! It is up to you!!	Choose a mountain in the UK. Find out how much rain falls each month throughout the year and create a bar chart. Write what you have found out. E.g. wettest month etc.	Create a mountains leaflet Try to answer these key questions What is a mountain? What makes it different to a hill? What are the four basic types of mountains? You could also include a glossary of the following terms:- mountain, mountain range, hill, valley, glacier, summit, peak and ridge.

Challenge: Create and complete your own task related to your class topic: Mountains. This could be a model or painting of a mountain scene. You could create a PowerPoint about a mountain in the world. It is up to you - be as creative as possible!
